

Welcome to the Spring Bulletin of the Dial

At the time of writing this, it's only a few days away from Mothering Sunday. Many Dad's will have taken their children to purchase cards and presents, at school and in uniformed organisations they may well have been making cards and gifts for their mums.

The history of Mothering Sunday, most Sunday people would worship at their nearest parish. It was deemed important for people to return to their home church (or Mother) church once a year. It became a time for family reunions when children who were working away from home would return home. Historians think it was the return to the 'Mother' Church which led to the tradition of children, particularly those working as domestic servants, or as apprentices being given the day off to go and visit their mothers and families. It was sometimes the case that Children as young as 10 would be sent out to work. That's quite a frightening thought to us these days. I certainly couldn't cope with my daughter leaving home at the age of 10.

Today Mothering Sunday has become more commercialised. I loved it when Sarah was at primary school and would come home with handmade cards and gifts, the ones that money can't buy.

Children love to make things and this leads into what will be happening at Mount Zion in the coming months. We are preparing for school children to come and visit us at Mount Zion to learn about the Wesley's, to learn about toys and games, what could and couldn't be played with on a Sunday

We are in the process of putting together a school package. The activities will be split into 3 groups: Making, Playing & Working. They will all do an activity within these 3 groups. Every child will make something in their group; each group will make something different.

The children will play with toys and play board games. Please have a look at see if you have any old board games that you would be prepared for us to borrow. When looking in a book of Victorian Games I realised that one of the games I used to play when I was little with my Grandma it was what she's played with as a child. My sister has found it and so we now have an original board game.

Those in the working group with do activities around the church and in the graveyard (if it's fine), they will also be able to sit and look at books when they have finished.

If you have any old toys or games that we could borrow that would be great.

We may need help on the day they come so if you would like to volunteer please let me know.

Please pray for the valuable work that we are undertaking at Mount Zion.

Methodist Heritage Tour. Sent in to us by Betty Jagger

As a born and bred Methodist I have always been interested in Methodist history and heritage, and in particular the life of John Wesley, the founder of Methodism. On two previous occasions, some years ago. Muriel (my sister) and I embarked on two heritage trails—one in London and the other in the Bristol area. When I saw an advertisement in the Methodist Recorder, for a tour of Central and Northern England I jumped at the idea of joining it

No Tour would be complete without visiting Epworth, in Lincolnshire, the home of the Wesley family. A guided tour of the Rectory, where the Wesley family lived, gave us an insight into the childhood of both John and his brother Charles. Sadly the Anglican Church where John Wesley's father was the rector was closed for renovations but we able to see Samuel Wesley's tomb in the graveyard and it was afoot this that John preached after he was forbidden to preach inside the church. I was also interested to see the Wesley Memorial Methodist Church again as it was there that my niece was christened when my brother David and his family were living in Epworth. Another " son " of Epworth was Alexander Kilham. Soon after John Wesley's death Kilham and his followers felt that the clergy in the Methodist Churches had too much power and that the laity should have more say in making decisions. (It is said that Wesley was very autocratic!) Kilham was excluded by the Wesleyan Methodists and he and his followers set up a breakaway church, first of all known as Kilhamites and then the Methodist New Connection. Much later, long after the various strands of Methodism had been reunited (1932), the manse which had belonged to the Kilhamites was sold to become an old people's home (as they were referred to then). It was thought that it would be good to keep the Kilham association alive in name until someone realised that Kilham Old People's Home was not quite the thing !.

The second breakaway from the Wesleyan tradition was that of the Primitive Methodism. Hugh Bourne and his friend William Clowes felt that the Wesleyans were not evangelical enough and as a result they too were excluded. Up on the Cheshire hillside above Mow Cop it was easy to imagine the group of "ranters" holding their camp meetings and singing with such fervour.

Down in the valley we visited Englesea Brook Museum of Primitive Methodism and saw a wonderful display of old banners – the kind which used to be carried at Sunday School Big Sings and Whitsuntide processions. Opposite the old chapel was the Grave and tomestone of Hugh Bourne, who had lived nearby.

It was a long day's outing to Oxford from our base in Derbyshire, but very rewarding to see the colleges (Christ Church and Lincoln) where John & Charles Wesley had been undergraduates and where later they had been ordained as Anglican clergymen. It was here that the Wesley brothers and their friends set up the Holy Club with its ordered approach to Bible study, prayer and works of charity, thus earning them the nickname of "Methodists"—name which stuck! Christ Church College also has associations with Lewis Carroll, the writer of "Alice in Wonderland" His real name was Arthur Dodgson and he had been a student and a tutor of Mathematics at Christ Church, where the dean at the time was Henry Liddell who had an enchanting young daughter call Alice. It is thought that she became the inspiration for Lewis Carroll's book and that the little green door we saw in the gardens is the featured in his book.

Moving north, we visited High House Chapel (built in 1760) which also houses the Weardale Museum. What a wonderful reception we received from four of the members and what an extensive collection of Wesleyana and local history items were on display, including a 4 panal tapestry of local history, rather similar to the Quaker Tapestry housed in Kendal. (The chapel reminded me of Mount Zion with it's Hird collection!)

A final visit was made to Whitby, not of specific Methodist heritage interest but the Abbey with its ancient Christian heritage and its wonderful position on the headland could not be ignored. It was a hectic holiday, but I wouldn't have missed it for anything!.




We have been able to start some of the repair work which was delayed due to the bad weather.




If this doesn't mess up your mind, I don't know what will!
